The Puppy Raisers' goals are to develop energetic and curious pups into mature, dependable dogs, with the following characteristics (excerpts guidedogs.com):

- A. Well-behaved- The pups have good house manners and will not be relieved in the house. They are quiet and calm, eat only their food, and are not destructive.
- B. Well-trained- The puppies complete Basic Dog Obedience Class, Good Canine Citizenship, Dog Etiquette Training, and Access Evaluation.
- C. Socialized to the world- The pups have been exposed to various people, things, and places and accept new situations calmly.
- D. Well-traveled- The puppies are relaxed and comfortable when traveling in all modes of transportation: cars, vans, buses, trains, airplanes, ferries, etc.
- E. People-friendly- The pups bond well with people, enjoy receiving verbal praise, and are eager to please.



- F. Animal-friendly- The pups are calm and appropriate around all sorts of animals, including dogs, cats, birds, livestock, and all animals they come in contact with.
- G. Responsive- The pups obey basic commands and are cooperative during various training exercises
- H. Read and honor the Our Dogs' Basic Fundamental Rights, PLEASE CLICK HERE TO READ.
- 31) Puppy with you 24/7- Goes everywhere with you to be exposed to all of life's adventures, challenges, difficulties, and realities. Disabled Handlers walk into all experiences, so socialization is vital! Be respectful of age-appropriate sleep and exposures for the puppy. Know that our Puppy Raiser Lead and our three Service Dog Trainers are all on call for our Puppy Raisers and Handlers; anything, we are here to support you and offer ideas as you become part of your community. ## MOBILITYDOG GUIDELINES FOR LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

We request 3 letters of recommendation for our Puppy Raiser Applicants. We are looking for the following information from the people who write those letters:

- 1) How long have you known this person?
- 2) Why do you think they want to raise a service dog?
- 3) Have they expressed interest in raising a dog for service to you?
- 4) Have you seen the applicant interacting with dogs? How do they treat the dogs?
- 5) Has the applicant ever owned a dog?
- 6) Has the applicant ever raised a puppy?
- 7) Does the applicant understand the training requirements and needs of caring for the dog? A poodle?
- 8) What is the applicant's support system who will assist with walks and socialization? Who is in it? How often are they around?
- 9) Does the applicant work? Away from home? Will the applicant be able to expose the puppy to the work environment?
- 10)Do you think that the applicant takes the dog out on field trips (restaurants, amusement parks, shopping, grocery shopping, movie theaters, libraries, public transportation, outdoor parks, recreation areas, etc.)exposing the SDiT to all of life?
- 11) Is the applicant a good communicator, will they participate in our community?
- 12) Is the applicant an "outdoors" person?
- 13) What is the applicant's spirit like?
